Their mission is to serve as a collective voice of the IAOS student body by inspiring innovation, providing a forum of ideas and promoting action to empower students to become the best mediums, healers, metaphysicians and/or ministers of the future.

On April 25, 2009 the Student Council members held their first meeting. A very open initial brainstorming discussion resulted in numerous excellent ideas to explore for future development. Thank you to the members of the Student Read and Feed who provided the funds to purchase and install two new high efficiency furnaces and air conditioners for the Chapel in the Woods. Pat Little and her fellow students have worked tirelessly over the past half dozen plus years to put on Read and Feed every month to raise funds, the majority of which have gone to reconditioning our beautiful chapel. With the additional aid of an anonymous donor, the new units were installed just in time for our opening and the 90 plus degree weather of Indiana. The old furnaces removed were originally installed back in the 1950's and held together with prayer, bailing wire and the hard work of Bob Patterson and others. Not only will the new units provide reliable heating and cooling, but it is estimated that they will reduce our utility bill by 40 to 50 percent. It is with Gratitude that we honor the Stewardship of our students and all who assist in the maintenance of Historic Camp Chesterfield.

PROPOSAL No. 1

Page 4, Article VIII, Section 1

Current Wording: The Executive Board of this Association shall consist of twelve (12) members. Ten (10) of these members including the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and six (6) Trustees must be Camp Chesterfield leaseholders owning property on the Camp grounds for at least one (1) year prior to election or appointment; and two (2) trustees who must be members of the Association for at least one (1) year prior to election or appointment and must be non-residents of Camp Chesterfield.

Proposed Wording: The Executive Board shall consist of twelve (12) members - President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and eight (8) Trustees. Eight (8) of these Executive Board Members must be Camp Chesterfield leaseholders owning property on the Camp grounds for at least one (1) year prior to election or appointment; and four (4) of these Executive Board Members must be from the membership who are not Camp Chesterfield leaseholders nor reside on the Camp grounds. Said members shall be current members of the Indiana Association of Spiritualists, Inc. and must have been so for at least the immediate three (3) consecutive years prior to election of appointment. This amendment shall be effective immediately upon adoption.

Reason for Change:

- I. There is little viable representation of the general (nonresident) membership on the Executive Board.
- II. Insignificant accountability to the membership for decisions regarding current and future plans including, but not limited to removal of buildings, and expenditures.
- III. Many residents have no inclination to be involved in the operation of the Association.
- IV. It is time for new perspectives and vigor.

PROPOSAL No. 2

Page 5, Article IXI, Section 2

Current Wording: Officers of the Association shall assume the duties of their office at the close of the Convention and continue in office until their successors are elected and qualified.

Proposed Wording: New Elected officers of the Association shall assume the duties of their office at the close of the Camp Season (Labor Day) and continue in office until their successors are elected and qualified. They may attend any Board Meetings after Convention and shall have a voice but not a vote.

Reason for Change: To provide better continuity for the business of the Association and to provide the new officers with understanding of what was and is taking place.

PROPOSAL No. 3

Page 8, Article XVIII, Section 1

Current Wording: During the period of the annual Camp Meeting, the Executive Board shall convene in regular **session once each week on a day and time to be designated by the board.....**

Proposed Wording: During the period of the annual Camp meeting, the Executive Board shall convene in regular session a minimum of twice a month on a day and time to be designated by the Board.

Reason for Change: Weekly meetings are not necessary and may cause a hardship for Board Members who must travel to attend meetings.

From the Treasurer:

Happy summer to everyone! Camp kicked off its 123rd season with a new season opening format that had everyone buzzing! It was a rousing success and many thanks to Rev. Suzanne Greer and Rev. Lynda Richey for coordinating the entire event. A huge thank you goes out to the many, many volunteers and workers who made the whole weekend possible!

Our financial news is both good and not quite as good. As reported in the last Messenger, Camp needs approximately \$25,000 per month to meet operational expenses. As usual, our largest expense continues to be maintenance and payroll, however our overall monthly expenses are encouraging! To date, we are under our reported budget figure of \$25,000/month. Currently we are averaging \$23,000 per month in expenses – something to cheer about!

The news which is “not quite as good” is that our average monthly income is not meeting our budget expectations and needs. We have had an enormous response to our earlier request for donations, and many wonderful souls have committed to our Stewardship program. A huge thank you to the many who responded to the call to stewardship! Unfortunately income is down in other areas, and our current monthly average at the end of May is \$18,500 in income.

So, we have the opportunity to do better! Indeed we must do better!

Again, there are many ways to contribute to Camp so that it can grow, prosper and live! Below is a list of some ideas that we shared in our last Messenger:

1. We have many wonderful events planned for this summer. We hope you will be able to join us at seminars, retreats, workshops and our worship services as often as possible.
2. Shop at our wonderful bookstore; eat at the Cafeteria; stay in our historic hotel!
3. If you are a member, and have not paid your dues yet, make a goal to do so by July 15th.
4. If you are not a member, and you love attending the many activities we offer, please consider becoming a member of our Camp Chesterfield family. Membership offers many benefits, so just stop by the office and sign up the next time you visit the grounds.
5. If you are not a member, but enjoy receiving Camp announcements via mail, please consider making a donation to help defray the cost of printing and postage.
6. If you have not submitted a stewardship form, please consider committing yourself to some level of stewardship: Lightbearer (\$10/month); Caregiver (\$20/month); Friend of Camp (\$50/month); Guardian of Camp (\$100/month); Steward of Camp (\$200/month).
